- considerate of socio-economic impact as well as inclusive

Key details:

- Duration: Plan for 35 minutes of presentation time, leaving ample space for Q&A.
- Slide submission: Send your slides at least 48 hours before your webinar for review.

Consider who your audience is

Your primary audience consists of UK-based healthcare professionals, including doctors, nurses, dietitians, and nutritionists. They seek practical, evidence-based information they can apply in clinical practice.

Please note that by agreeing to do this webinar you are consenting to recording of the webinar presentation and live Q&A. Structure Your Presentation and Introduce Yourself

- Begin with a brief personal introduction and why this topic matters to you
- Present three clear learning objectives
- Organise content into digestible sections
- End with a clear summary of key takeaways e.g. 5 takeaways
- Include a reference list

Sharing Evidence and Patient Case Studies

- Focus on current, peer-reviewed research
- Include relevant patient case studies (ensure no identifiable information)
- Provide practical implementation strategies
- No animal studies please there are plenty of excellent studies that do not use non-human animals
- Include statistics relevant to UK healthcare settings where possible

Health Equity Considerations

- Include at least one slide addressing social determinants of health
- Consider socioeconomic factors in any recommendations you make
- Use inclusive language and non-stigmatising imagery e.g. around obesity
- Address cultural and ethnic variations in health outcomes
- Acknowledge barriers to implementation e.g. lack of access to green spaces
